DID YOU KNOW?...



In today's Gospel God passage proclaims that Jesus is "....Son, His the Beloved". Through our baptism, which makes us part of the Body of Christ. we also become beloved

children of our loving God.

Through baptism all our sins are forgiven and so we are purified from sin, including original sin. We are taken from death (sin) to life (grace). It is not so much that we are changed or transformed by baptism. Rather, we are born again, thus becoming a completely new person, a "new creation" as St. Paul puts it (2 Cor. 5:17).

Traditionally, baptism has been carried out by immersing the person in water. This ritual means that upon immersion the old self of the person dies spiritually – just as the body would die physically if deprived of air. When the baptized emerges from the water he or she is reborn in Christ.

At the present time, although the Church uses water poured or sprinkled three times on the head of the person being baptized, the older method of immersion is also being re-introduced. The rebirth of the baptized into Christ and his people takes place regardless of the ceremony followed.

At the heart of baptism are the words of the priest: He proclaims the name and adds "...I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..."
